### **DOCS TIPS**

# "Watch your back"

No I am not suggesting that anyone is out to get you. I mean watch out that you don't hurt your back. All those around the 60 year mark will remember the Dr McKenzie's Menthoids add on the TV for the relief of lumbago and sciatica. Well I don't know what was in them or if they worked or not but they were for the treatment of 'bad back' or for those of us 50y and up – degenerative disease of the spine, especially the lumbar area.

Our spines are rather like centipedes, we have 7 cervical or neck vertebrae, 12 thoracic or chest vertebrae and 5 lumbar or lower back vertebrae before we get to the tail bones, the sacrum and coccyx. We also have 24 discs that separate these vertebrae and it's at these points that the nerves exit on either side. If a disc gets squashed then so does the nerve, this will cause lumbago (lower back pain) as the lumbar area is the most commonly affected and sometimes Sciatica, where the pain is telegraphed down one or both legs according to which spinal level is affected. It can really be a disabling event if you get a "prolapsed disc". So the message is don't use your back as a crane. If you lift anything, bend at the knees and keep a straight back, do not bend at the waist, you may strain your lower back and this will definitely put you out of action and put you off the road. 9.00am, Sunday, 18 December 2011; nearly the end of the year. About 25 bikes assembled at the Lismore Railway station for the last organized club run. The Destination? Frank Widdows house in Ballina, for a sausage sizzle. Thank you, Frank and Lynn; your hospitality much appreciated!

We headed up the road to Dunoon, turning right at Duncans Road just before Dunoon, and then follow through to Numulgi. Left at the old school onto Lockton road and through Bexhill, and then follow Eltham and Teven roads to Ballina. An excellent ride followed by excellent sausages and tea and coffee.

The weather held out for us with a few showers AFTER most of us had returned home for lunch. A couple of late comers turned up at Ballina joined the feast, and only one lonely WLA seemed to drop off somewhere, but even it eventually arrived.

An interesting note for those wanting to save money on electricity. Frank has opted for Time of Use (TOUS) metering which charges different fees per kW hr depending on the time. By fitting timers to his dishwasher, washing machine and dryer (hardly used) so they only operate at low demand times, Frank has saved over \$140 per quarter!! This is smart metering!

Once again, Thank you to Frank and Lynn and Uncle Eric as cook.

### Last Mid Week Run / 28/12/11.

Due to cloudy skies and windy conditions (plus I suppose all the usual family/festive annual Christmas commitments) only 3 stalwarts turned up at 9AM at the old Lismore Railway Station for the Mid-Week Run on the 4th Wednesday of December 2011. But the good news was that all three were classic 2-strokes. Ray, after a quick change from his dry-clutched Norton Commando, rode his 1978 Suzuki X7 250 twin, Noel our Editor on his trusty 1976 Yamaha RD 250 and your scribe on his red 1983 Yamaha RZ 250. All these machines are capable of good cruising speeds and excellent acceleration.



Unexpectedly, in addition to the change-over at

Ray's house we had the pleasant, though perhaps for some a frightening encounter with Ray's dogs. One was an Irish Wolf-Hound that was as big as a small rider seated on his machine. Who needs a burglar-alarm with such a lovely big beast! My 1983 RZ being the direct descent of the famous "Elsie" (thus called in some markets an RDLC2/YPVS) and being an early model it still has the inherited single-piston dual front disc-brakes, so I was keen to try-out/bed-in some newly-fitted carbon-fibre/kevlar organic front brake-pads, fitted (hopefully) for an improvement in the braking department. Given our enthusiast participants it was decided for a longer than usual run this week. This took us from South Lismore onto the Kyogle backroad, through Bentley to Manifold Road, through Casino, to well past Ellangowan village and then, back-tracking to Yorkleigh Hall and then via Horse Ridges to Tatham, Coraki and then coffee at Woodburn. We mutually decided against the 24Km dirtroad short-cut to Coraki from Elangowan, even though it was calculated it would have taken a full 40Km off the 120Km route. But in recompense, the countryside was superbly green and there were some great corners with practically no traffic on these sealed back-roads. Most of the rural homes we cruised past still had innovative and sometimes amusing Christmas decorations displayed and the livestock seemed to be enjoying the cooleer conditions too.

At the planned Woodburn coffee-stop we encountered Barry Day and his charming wife, both riding modern Triumphs all the way from Griffith MCC [www.griffithmcc.org]. After some minor refuelling in packed "last chance before Maclean" servo conditions, (don't you just love the manoeuvrability of a motorcycle in congested traffic!) we set off back to Lismore via the Woodburn Bridge and The Big Hill. Due to lack of time, this was not the planned route through Baggotville and Meerschaum Vale/Rous Road as was initially hoped. Even so, the planned 200Km 'brake-pad bed-down trip' was logged at 170Km on our Speedo tripmeters. The red Commodore was patrolling the Lismore/Woodburn Road as expected, but as we were caught in 90Km tin-top traffic, no "ticket" transpired. These lightweight and good-handling little two-strokes are quite capable of comfortably completing longer distances - if you give them a chance and are prepared for the fuel bills! The new brake-pads performed well and I think "organic" pads seem to be much "kinder" to the discs than the former fully-metallic ones. See you on the next MWR!

### CONFEDERATION OF HISTORIC MOTOR CLUBS MEETING **HELD IN QUEANBEYAN, OCTOBER 2011**

# REGARDING THE MATTER OF REGISTRATION **OF HISTORIC VEHICLES**

Members may recall my bringing this up at our September meeting and the response was only one member saw fit to put his thoughts forward. There were 33 car and bike clubs representatives present in Queanbeyan and the following is a short account of what happened.

There are approx 21000 members of historic clubs in NSW,

The National Code VSB14, states the maximum allowance in power increase is 20%, which is easily obtained by an engine overhaul or additional carby, (cars) so this will be lobbied

Tyre date stamp—All new tyres have a manufactured date stamp and recommended tyre life of 5 years. How will this effect Historic vehicle use?

The Confederation reported on a meeting with RTA re log books etc, and RTA said it was researching the Victorian and South Australian registration changes, and said that if current method of rego is kept in NSW, there would be a review to "iron out the bugs".

RTA also said there is a push to "harmonise" the H rego scheme nationally and there will be full consultation if this proceeds (The writers opinion is that this will happen, just a matter of how long before it does come in NSW?)

The Committee will keep you informed as news comes to hand.
