Deans trip to the snow. { and The Newcastle CMC Rally }

With A trip to Jindabyne with the family for some snow planned for quite some time and not having any time at all for any riding lately I thought to myself lets see if there is any rallies on, I could throw the bike in the trailer and drop in on the way. Don't you love it when things go exactly according to plan! With a quick stop at Timbertown, Wauchope on the way the Newcastle Classic Motorcycle clubs rally was on the 16th and 17th August so we timed it perfectly on our way to the snow.

Not sure if over the years Dad ever attended this rally but it was rather nice to meet up with some familiar faces Dennis Clem, Brisbane and Peter Arnull from Grafton. The Stockton Beach caravan park was the starting point and where we stayed for a few days, very handy spot too with the ferry close by the wife managed to catch the ferry over to Newcastle city for some shopping which you always have to think of these things when on a bike rally ha ha. It was also a rather fitting day to be riding in a rally on Dads 4th Anniversary since his death. I Had a few teary moments under the helmet that's for sure thinking of all the great times I had as kid with mum and dad doing exactly this, classic bike rallies!

The rally headed off Sat morning out into the Hunter Valley and the family followed on until morning tea time where we stopped at the Bolwarra Primary school. My little bloke Vincent had a great look around successfully touching the front mudguards of almost every bike and guess what his first words were? Car. Alecia and Nathalia enjoyed the beautiful cakes and home made scones too!! Welcome to the world of bike rallies, great people, great bikes, great food and great places life couldn't be better and the weather was really on our side too.

From there we rode out towards Singleton where I hooked onto the back of some really nice old AJS's, stopped to help a fellow on a Rudge Special and finished for lunch up at Vacy Fire Station. What a feed put on by the Bush Fire Brigade who only do 1 function a year, the Newcastle Classic Bike Rally event, the rest of the year they are all over the country fighting fires!! This gave me some time to really have a good look at the 150 or so bikes on display, the favourite for me was a 1955 AJS Model 18H, Not even new bikes today look this good!! The bikes included a collection of BMW's, Nortons, Ariels, 1 Velocette, a Condor, AJS, Matchy's, Col Sunderlands V Twin JAP, BSA's, Ducatis, Japanese bikes, a couple of beaten up Harleys, A couple of beautiful old Indians and only 1 side car but No Vincents!! Oh almost forgot there was some Triumphs too. I rode the Norton Dominator 88 and had an absolute ball riding this old girl – a big thank you goes out to Pat Holt and John Café for helping me get the teething problems out of this bike.

From here unintentionally I followed the same group of AJS gents (isn't it funny how on rallies you usually always end up behind the same bikes) back into Maitland where they waived me in to the local pub for a quick brew and then asked if I wanted to join them down in Stockton for a couple more. What a great bunch of fellas talking bikes and drinking beer for a couple of hours, where I took a new liking to BSA's. There was an elderly chap Allan Gillan showcasing his rather used BSA 1955 A7S that he bought new and after riding it 40miles to work every day for 41 years had done 370,000 miles and apart from the usual wear components has only had 3 rebuilt engines and some gearbox work. 


- 1. RMS has received submissions relating to the Log Book Trial, and will provide an update on the status of the trial and review in early September 2019.
- 2. CHMC has made the following recommendations in its submission to the survey:
 - Log Books be a permanent option, with both Clubs and individual members free to elect to not take part in the Scheme.
 - Log Book use to be a maximum of 60 days, but should insurers follow the precedents set in Victoria for stepped CTP rates, options of 15, 35 and 60 days use be offered.
 - The Log Book to be more robust, A5 or A6 in size, with a firm cover, conditions printed within, and sufficient space for 3 years use (180 fields).
 - Fields in the Log Book be of sufficient size to permit clearly legible entries.
 - Clubs be a party to the Log Book Scheme, with RMS Form 1259 being altered to include an election to take part in the Log Book Scheme, and also a record of the number of Log Book days used in the previous year.
 - Conditions of Log Book use be clarified, in particular prohibiting use for:
 - Hire or reward
 - o Travel to or for regular employment, business trips and regular personal trips.
- CHMC is very grateful to the number of Clubs responding to the Survey, and especially to the many individual members who made available time and out of pocket costs to attend the Focus Group Sessions in Parramatta. Your input has been highly valued and we thank you sincerely.
- 4. Clubs are reminded of two major events in 2020:
 - The AHMF Rally at Albury Wodonga 28th March to 4th April.
 - Temora's "I don't want to go Home" Rally from 4th to 7th April, during which the 2020 CHMC AGM will be held.


