#### The tale of an old fool's whim to ride a 65 year old Indian Chief across America...... CHAPTER ONE

I have few rules or guiding principles by which I live my life. One of those is to leave challenges for young people and fools. I cannot imagine then how riding a 65 year old Indian Chief across America snuck past the keeper as a good idea - or why I didn't chase it off the front veranda like some pushy phone-plan salesman.

Given the obviously challenging nature of this idea and the fact I am seldom considered young- especially by attractive women, potential employers and life insurance brokers - I was left with the uncomfortable realisation that maybe I really was a fool. Sadly this realisation was given striking credence when I finally set eyes on my "New, mint condition and freshly restored" 1947 Indian. We had met on the net and it was one of those sad and all too familiar cases of *internet dating syndrome*.

You arrive at the agreed rendezvous location, lured by the attractive and fresh image from the profile. You scan the venue but to your horror and dismay there is only a much older and more weathered version, waiting expectantly. Before you can activate your legs into reverse mode your stupid hand goes up and you are now committed to an uncomfortable experience. In this case the experience involved setting off to ride across a continent on a machine that was clearly not "Mint, freshly restored or new" and bore little resemblance to the 12 year old photos on the website. Just to add to my shame, I had been done by a Kiwi - a well known "Indian dealer" in Los Angeles who turned out not to really be a "dealer" but "just someone who bought and sold bikes"!

An uncomfortable silence accompanied my first face to face with the Kiwi over the bike, with its peeling paint and chrome, and sad rats nest of wires in the generator area. Somehow that Kiwi kept a straight face until I was off the premises. My pedigree as a fool was now thoroughly confirmed.

In case you have missed the privilege of riding an Indian - an old, proper one that is, there are a few little nuances that are worth noting in the interests of survival. The throttle, for example, is the left hand twist grip. Oh, and then there's the foot clutch and hand gear change, the Suicide Shift, or Excitement Accelerator, as I prefer to think of it. And did I mention the right hand twist grip is the manual advance control?

Learning to ride this beast, on the wrong side of the road against 40 years of conditioning and in LA, was roughly equivalent to learning to play the violin with your toes, but far more dangerous!

Still, I have a tired looking, 65 year old motorcycle that had not been down a road in six years judging by the Texas registration tag, a surly GPS that refused point blank to assist in locating any addresses in a little town like LA, no backup and little by way of a plan. What could possibly go wrong?

So with deep and well justified trepidation I set the GPS to a two horse town to the North West that it found more acceptable than LA, manoeuvred the Indian onto the first freeway on-ramp and tried to remember to breath. Piloting the star ship Indian for the first time I felt like Kirk on the bridge of a primitive Enterprise, but without a crew. Phil Irving described his first ride on an Indian Chief as being like a yachtsman at the helm of the Queen Mary. I could certainly relate to that assessment but Phil no doubt had less traffic to contend with.

The old girl got up a head of steam in the very slow lane. My mind slowly adjusted to the terrifying cacophony of rattles emanating from the internal combustion drive unit of Starship Indian and there was a slight reduction in my adrenalin levels and heart rate. They still fluctuated wildly, as great lumps of iron piloted by frenzied prisoners of LA shot past at warp speed or the neurotic GPS sadistically left it to the last minute to mention I might consider crossing four lanes of traffic to exit left within 70m or risk eternity lost in a black hole on the far edge of Galaxy LA Freeway. Thus the odyssey began. I knew every passing mile increased my chances of getting out of LA alive. I was about to commence my discovery of America with no less nervous excitement than Columbus. America, where road rules change at every State boundary, where the general population can comfortably accommodate fundamental Christian ideas on one hand and the notion it is your god given right to blast your neighbour with a Glock under a broad range of circumstances on the other; where even vegetarians preferred their artichokes freshly shot; hamburgers are made with cake and English is rapidly becoming the second language.

Don't get me wrong. On the whole, Americans are polite, hospitable and helpful. Well mostly anyway. There are a few well known, and not so well known, "hospitality and helpful free" zones. Bad things happen in places like Oakland, Detroit and East St Louis or any number of other "Best Visited on Video" destinations. While I had no defined itinerary when I rolled out of LA, I was quickly gathering an itinerary of places to avoid. I didn't share this to the GPS. Our relationship remained frosty and cloaked with mutual suspicion.

Having spent a large part of my life in the outdoors, I have become pretty ho hum about landscape generally. As a motorcyclist it is also easy to focus on the ribbon of winding blacktop landscape to the exclusion of the bigger picture until you actually come to a halt.

Nothing prepared me for the North American landscape. America, or Hollywood perhaps, has uncharacteristically undersold its landscape. It isn't just the variety but the rapid change in landscapes that demands your attention. Riding through Yellowstone I passed through lowland meadows with postcard streams, grazing bison, deer and all manner of critters. Half an hour later the pastures are shooting super-heated steam and sulfur skyward, the mud is boiling and the real estate has a very temporary feel about it. By lunchtime I am parked beside a frozen lake at 9,500 feet, wondering if I can possibly fit my last tee shirt under everything else I own and still change gears. It hardly mattered. 45 minutes later I have dropped a couple of thousand feet and am back to a shirt and jeans, riding through spectacular gorges and jutting dog tooth peaks in the beautiful Wapiti Valley, stomping ground of Buffalo Bill Cody. This is one of the real treats of riding USA. Get off the interstates and hit the back roads and scenic byways . The riding is more relaxed and the landscape is bound to blow you away with all those things Hollyweird forgot to show you and some they did.

At my second fuel stop out of LA that I realised those were not clouds on the horizon but snow covered mountains. I felt totally deceived by the Beach Boys, the weather man and all those things I had heard about California! Sadly gas stations become a way of life when touring. I slowly became addicted to sickly sweat French Vanilla cappuccinos in one gallon styrofoam cups and developed an aversion for most of the solid, food-like, substances peddled at gas stations that I generically categorised as "road kill". Mysteriously the seat post on the old Indian protested louder and sank deeper after every stop.


Then there are the 37 variants to the gas pump - all designed to make the foreign tourist look like a complete imbecile, incapable of even pumping his own gas, not to mention the payment options. Credit card, prepay, pay after - or for the more adventurous- don't pay at all. Of course there is one thing you do have to love about the US gas station the price of fuel.

Gas stations, automobiles and highways are a religion for an entire slice of American culture and the gas stations are the wayside chapels where all come to pray, pay and play. The gas station caters for every need or whim of the auto bound American. There are gas stations with Casinos, lap dance lounges, crack whores, and of course gun shops.

But I digress, so back to the Indian. While adjusting to the rattles and mysterious noises of a 65 year old side valve motor can be somewhat disconcerting, I assure you it is nowhere near as disconcerting as the sudden silence of that 65 year old motor in the middle of the Mohave Desert.

This I discovered five hours into my five week trip when the clatter of the engine suddenly stopped and the bike came to an sudden and unscheduled stop. My first thought was whether it was even against the law in the US to shoot Kiwis, especially one as dodgy as my friendly Indian dealer? As I came to terms with the situation my second thought involved young people, fools and self harm! Was a lonely death in this inhospitable environment to be my reward for stupidity?
