"Being presented with the Best Restored Bike for the year 2011Award was very pleasing for me as being recognised by fellow restorers. The announcement was a surprise considering the photos of the other entrants bikes and the obvious efforts involved", Dave said. It was unfortunate that owing to health issues Jack Ahearn was unavailable to be present so his 2 expert judges, Eric Wilson and John Cafe officiated with our president Pat Holt in presenting the award to Dave. As the 4 bikes were presented to the judges in such magnificently restored condition there was only a few points difference in deciding the winner. Eric and John both said how difficult it was to judge, it was so close.

Dave gave me a brief rundown on the history of his 1971 Silver Shot Gun 450 Ducati. He bought it in poor condition in

1985 and


joined the NRCMCC in 1988. In 2005 he commenced restoration procedures and made every effort to identify the bike and its authenticity. Major accident damage resulted in the motor cycle being rebuilt using late model components, by the previous owner. These anomalies were recognised by Phil Hitchcock (of Road and Race) and the Ducati museum in Italy. Dave was helped by his brother John in the electroplating and assisted in the production of the silver paint with the flake presenting quite a problem but the end result was superb. Well done Dave. Noel Edwards.

New speed zones proposed

UK politicians are proposing an increase in English speed limits and reckon millions of dollars will be saved rather than lost by fine revenue.

A full public consultation will be launched in 2012 with a view to implementing the speed changes in 2013. It won't be across the board though, only the 110km/h highway speed limit is targeted for the change up to 130km/h. The secretary from the UK department of Transport stated, "I want to make sure that our motorway speed limit reflects the reality of modern vehicles and driving conditions, NOT those of 50 years ago. "While we must ensure that our roads remain the safest in the world, we must also consider the huge economic benefits that can be created by shortening journey times," he continued.

The Department of Transport's press release went further: Vehicles have changed dramatically since the current national speed limit was set in 1965. Technological advances mean that cars are significantly safer than they were – contributing to a fall of more than 75 per cent in the number of people killed on British roads since 1965. That is why the government feels it is now time to look again at wether the speed limit set in 1965 is still appropriate.

"Safety cannot be the only consideration when setting speed limits. Previous analysis shows that raising the motorway speed limit would generate significant economic benefits; worth hundreds of millions of pounds per year from savings of travel time . . . initial work by the department suggests that setting the motorway speed limit to 80 mph is likely to represent the best balance of costs and benefits and is similar to the motorway speed limits in other EU countries." *Cont. page 4*

Barry Sheene Festival of Speed

The 7th annual QBE Barry Sheene festival of Speed will be held at Eastern Creek on March 23/25.

This event is one of the biggest meetings on the Australian Road Racing calendar. It is billed

as a festival and it's exactly that. Besides the racing there's displays from numerous clubs, a huge show'n'shine, trade displays and spectators can get right up close with the racers and their bikes.

In 2011 spectator numbers were fantastic, and they have grown each year since the event's inception. Former world champion and Isle Of Man TT winner Graeme Crosby will fly across from New Zealand as the team captain for his country. There is expected to be a big showing from the Kiwis, both with solos and sidecars.

UK classic racing champion Bill Swallow has been confirmed for the event, racing a Manx Norton, as has 'Mr. Superbike' Robbie Phillis and multiple Aussie superbike champion Shawn Giles (see photo) both on period 5 Suzuki Katanas.

Malcolm Campbell will be riding a Honda RC 30 in the period class, and there could even be a Honda Moto3 GP bike doing demo laps. And there is more with two all girl sidecar teams bringing a bit of glamour to the festival.



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


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Lismore Motor Cycles Dart Run
