#### **Message from President**

G'day all,

Welcome to November. Although we've been able to restart our regular rides we're still a bit hit and miss with the monthly meetings because of the size of the Clunes hall and the spacing that we have to impose on everyone to comply with Covid Restrictions. Added to this is that we're not considered to be an "Essential Service" so we run into more problems with the club having to exclude based on a person's vaccination status at the moment. We're not meeting in November because of all of the restrictions but as the restrictions are removed early December we can plan for our December meeting and the AGM. Both will be on the second Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> December starting at 7:30pm.

Committee nomination forms are included in the newsletter for use by anyone who wants to be step up and run for a committee position in 2022.

The forms are pretty straight forward but it might be time for a quick reminder how the voting works. The next NRCMCC rego day will be held on Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> December between 9am and 12md.

**It may finish earlier if no one turns up!!!!** At this point in time the Covid rules will allow us to cater to all bikes that need to be inspected during the December – January period. Please remember that the club has a break over Christmas and recommences in February so please be fair to the registration officers and if your bike is due for rego during that period turn up to the registration day. People go away over Christmas and you may find that there's no one around over that period to do your inspection.

**The Club Christmas meal** is to be held at the Lismore Heights Sports Club on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> December commencing 6:30ish. More on the next Rego Day—taken from email sent by President on 28th October


If your bike falls due for rego in December-January then this is the rego day for you.

Please don't hold off till January expecting to turn up at an inspector's home for an inspection because people may not be around to do your rego for you at that time.

If it is the first registration then please check the club rules because they state that:

"any motorcycle built after 1949 being presented for initial historic registration authentication, must be accompanied by a pink or blue slip from an authorised inspection station."

#### ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR MOTORCYCLES on the Historic Vehicle Scheme (HVS): Motorcycles must be as CLOSE TO ORIGINAL CONDITION as possible with NO ALTERATIONS

except for safety features, such as rear view mirrors & turn indicators and must be over 30 years old. Motorcycle Usage:

NRCMCC members are permitted to participate in **Club events** listed on the NRCMCC webpage, at <u>NRCMCC.org</u>, without having to make an entry in their logbook.

Members that are on the RMS logbook scheme must fill their logbook for each day's use **if it is not a club event**. A logbook entry is required for maintenance rides (eg test runs) & personal use and the logbook should be carried with you while riding the bike.

The log book can be used as soon as it's issued to record the days you use the bike. The number of days allocated for use depends on the remaining length of conditional registration when the log book is issued. Only one person is required to record the daily use of the motorcycle. If there are multiple riders on the same day, the initial rider on the day must complete the line entry for that day.

Carrying a Club Magazine /Events Listing and a current Membership Card/Receipt, while not a HVS requirement, is regarded as a worthwhile practice.

## More on BMWs {newer}

#### A SUPERCHARGED BMW R100 BUILT BY AN F1 DESIGNER

.Ben Norton builds custom motorcycles, during the day he's a designer at a Works Formular 1 team, which explains why his super charged BMW R100RT is so mental, this is Bens only second build, his first was an R80RT Café racer

Aiming for an aggressive street tracker style, Ben nicknamed the project the R107K. The 107 references the 1,070 cc Siebenrock kit he's dropped into the motor, and the 'K' stands for Kompressor-the usual German designation for supercharged vehicles. The engine work extends far beyond just the big bore kit, with modifications to the block itself to lighten it. Ben has also added low compression copper head gaskets and twin spark heads, and revised the breather system. The exhaust is custom too, with mandrel-bent (and tuned) stainless steel headers, terminating in a TYGA MotoGP-style muffler. Mixing petrol and methanol meant that Ben needed reservoirs to hold both, so he fabricated separate aluminum tanks for each. There's a methanpump and level sensor under there too, and the filler caps and breather valves are from Newton.Ben also installed a Setrab oil cooler with a remote filter sump from Motoren-Israel, and a Toyota starter motor. The cthe engine now breathes in through a single Mikuni HSR carb with a DNA air filter, clutch was converted to a hydraulic system, with a custom billet actuation arm. The front forks came off a first generation BMW S1000RR The BMW's dry weight sits at around 188 kilos (415 pounds) now-about 30 kg less than stock. Ben hasn't put it on the dyno yet though, because he's still running it in. "I'm only running 0.5 bar boost," he says, "but I plan to run more boost and methanol in the future, once confidence is gained." It took Ben 18 months to wrap up the R107K, and frankly, It's a remarkable build for a hobbyist, and we can't wait to see what he's got planned next.










## WORLD'S SHORTEST FAIRY TALE?
