#### Riding over the Khardung La Pass 18,300 ft above sea level,

In 2019 I was part of a group of mates who traveled to India to ride Royal Enfield motorcycles through the Himalayan mountains and over the highest motorable mountain pass in the world, or so we thought. We did hear of another mountain pass that was higher but were told it's a military controlled road only so we dismissed this one. Well, we have since heard that you can get a permit to ride this road although permission can be withdrawn at any time as this area of India borders China and there is military conflict almost every day. That in itself is unique as the conflict is often hand to hand combat and several soldiers a year die as a result.

Anyway, in 2019 we rode over Khardung La pass; twice. Khardung La's official height then, as it changes every year, was 17,982 ft above sea level. Today it's 18,300 ft above sea level as the Himalayan mountains are rising every year.

We have booked our tickets and are now going back to India in August to ride through the amazing Himalayan mountains again and this time through the Spiti Valley and then to cross over the true worlds highest motorable pass, the Umling La pass which is 1,000 ft higher than Khardung La at 19,300 ft above sea level. To put that into perspective, jumbo jets fly at this height, base camp on Mt Everest is over 1,000 ft LOWER and our Mt Kosciusko is a lovely 7,310 ft above sea level. We are riding at almost 3 times this height. And yes, we all got altitude sickness and expect it again but this years ride will see us take a few more days at altitude before we get to the Umling La pass so we hope to acclimatise to this altitude over the 19 day ride. There will be a story later in the year so watch this space.

#### Jack Ahearn- Man or Machine

The trophy Jack donated to the club is the trophy received when he came second in the F.I.M Road racing WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP behind Mike Hailwood. 1964 was the beginning of the  $16^{\text{th}}$  season which started on  $2^{\text{nd}}$  February in USA and finished 1<sup>st</sup> November in Japan. It was in this year that Jack won the Finnish Grand Prix on 30 August 1964. One of the most important facts to remember is that Jack in his early career was riding as a privateer i.e. no corporate sponsorship. He always won enough to get to and race in the next round.

1954 Jack's oversees racing career started aged 30 in 1954 at the Isle of Man TT on a 350cc Norton he also raced a  $\overline{500cc}$  Norton coming 9<sup>th</sup> in the race.

1955 he also started racing in Grand Prix Motorcycle circuit in both 350cc & 500cc on the Norton's.

350cc IOM 10<sup>th</sup> Germany 10<sup>th</sup>, Belgium 9<sup>th</sup>, 500cc IOM NC Germany 6<sup>th</sup>, Belgium 7<sup>th</sup> gaining him 1 race points and 26<sup>th</sup> in the world ranking 1<u>958</u> 350cc AJS 7R IOM 17<sup>th</sup> place

500cc Matchless G5.0 IOM 29<sup>th</sup> place

1962 Jack once again contesting Grand Prix Motorcycle racing this time back on Norton's' in both 350cc & 500cc. 350cc IOM 17<sup>th</sup>.

500cc IOM NC

**1963** saw Jack adding 125cc Ducati IOM 21<sup>st</sup> place

350cc IOM 5<sup>th</sup>, Netherlands 5<sup>th</sup> gaining him 4 race points and 11th in the world ranking. 500cc IOM 9<sup>th</sup>, Netherlands 4<sup>th</sup>, Belgian 5<sup>th</sup>gaining him 5 race points and 10th in the world ranking. **1964** at the age of 40 years saw him racing in the 125cc Honda, 250cc Suzuki 350cc Norton & 500cc Norton.

**1964** at the age of 40 years saw min racing in the 125cc Honda, 250cc Buzuki 550cc Honton & 500cc Honton 125cc Honda France 8<sup>th</sup>, the Suzuki he didn't place. 350cc IOM NC, Italian 6<sup>th</sup> in the Italian Grand Prix ranking him 22<sup>nd</sup> in the world rankings.. 500cc Norton IOM 14<sup>th</sup>, Dutch TT 4<sup>th</sup>, Belgian Grand Prix 4<sup>th</sup>, German Grand Prix 2<sup>nd</sup>, DDR 6<sup>th</sup>, Ulster Grand Prix 3<sup>rd</sup>, Finnish Grand Prix 1<sup>st</sup>, Italian Grand Prix NAT 3<sup>rd</sup>, Jack didn't contest either the USA or Japanese Grand Prix gaining him 25 race points and 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the world rankings. Our trophy is the trophy awarded him in this year. **1965** 500cc Norton 9<sup>th</sup>, IOM, Dutch 5<sup>th</sup>, DDR (Germany) 4<sup>th</sup>, Czech 3<sup>rd</sup>, gaining him 9 race points and 5<sup>th</sup> in the world ranking

<u>1966</u> Jack once again contested both 350cc and 500cc on Norton's.
350cc German DDR 6<sup>th</sup>, Finnish 3<sup>rd</sup>, IOM 4<sup>th</sup>, earning him 8 race points and 8<sup>th</sup> in the world rankings.
500cc Belgian 3rd, Germany DDR 3<sup>rd</sup>, Czech 5<sup>th</sup>, Finnish 4<sup>th</sup>, IOM NC gaining him 13 race points and 6<sup>th</sup> in the world ranking.

1974 Jack changed to a 350cc Yamaha IOM 34<sup>th</sup> place.

#### **Rules for the Jack Ahearn Trophy-**

Entrant must have been a financial member of the club for at least 12 months

Motorcycles must be at least 30 years or older (Historical status)

Motorcycles completely restored by a professional restorer or machines purchased by members, already restored, are not eligible

The Motorcycles may have parts replaced, engines repaired, paintwork completed by professionals but the entrant must have completed a proportion of the restoration themselves.

The Motorcycles must be running and on full or historical registration.

In the event there is no entry for a particular year, the trophy will be held over for the following year

Award will be made for the preceding 12 months. (With the exception of the inaugural which covered two years of 2008 & 2009)

The appointed judge's decision to be final unless unmitigated circumstances arise where the club committee rules.

The trophy will be presented at a club social event most likely in the first half of the following year.

Entrants must notify the committee their intentions to enter prior to 31st December of each year.

Motorcycles, mopeds or sidecar outfit, of any make to be as close to factory original, which excludes such Motorcycles as Tritons, Rickman's, café racers or other specials.

The purpose of the award is to encourage the restoration and preservation of motorcycle in line with the clubs charter.

The trophy is inscribed "The Jack Ahearn Trophy, for the best annual restoration of a classic motorcycle" and the winners name, machine details, and year awarded inscribed on a plate affixed to the base. This trophy was donated to the Northern Rivers Classic Motorcycle Club Inc and will remain as club property for as long as the club runs, if in the event of the club folding the committee at this time will decide the trophies fate be it to go to another club or to a museum like the Inverell Motor Museum or the Bathurst Track Museum.

The winner will receive a suitable certificate or small trophy, and details will be in the following newsletter.

Each item to be marked out of 10 points, with more points given to entrants work over professionals for example if all painting is by entrant, then points awarded will be higher than professional painting, same if wheels are re-spoke by entrant, etc

What does the word restoration means?- The action of returning something to a former condition.


