The 2023 Frostbite Rally

Several NRCMCC members ventured up to frosty Qld recently to attend the Warwick branch of the HMCCQ's 29th annual Frostbite Rally. Why do they call it the Frostbite Rally? Hmmmm, let me tell you it is for good reason, it was a chilli -2 on Sunday morning!

The Warwick club is a small club but continually pulls off this great rally in the middle of winter to ride around the open plains and flat country of the southern Darling Downs of Qld. This rally was well attended with over 100 vintage and classic bikes, I think Adam's 1930's BSA twin was one the oldest along with a plethora of Indians and some great old British bikes as well as a great selection of post war BMW's and many many more.


This rally is based at the Allora Showgrounds and is an average speed event and this year Julia and I elected to take our 1988 BMW R100RS and did the long ride, 70km/hr run. We chose the BM as it had the advantage of heated grips, heated foot warmers (cylinders) plus a fairing to keep the snow and ice at bay, remember it's called the Frost-bite Rally for good reason! And to our surprise we WON our class with our time being spot on an average of 70km/hr. We were more than surprised as we didn't set out to maintain an average speed of 70km/hr or to win a prize, and we did take a wrong turn once so had to turn around half a km down the road and we stopped to take a photo along the way too. How lucky were we?

Anyway, a good time was had by all, it was great to see Mary back in the saddle riding her V50 Moto Guzzi but I don't think they truly got the Frost Bite theme as their van was so warm it was closer to Bali in summer than Allora in winter. Bryson sure had the heaters cranked up. Ha ha.

So next year will be the Warwick Branch of the HMCCQ's 30th anniversary Frostbite Rally so we for one will be going. Wednesday Club Rides

Club Mid-Week Ride to Drake on 24/05/23

The ride to Drake on 24/5/23 went ahead in sunny but crisp morning conditions for around 10 riders planning to meet-up with 'Bonalbo Mick' at the combined tourist/coffee/computer/gallery shop there. One rider unfortunately had to drop out due to ignition problems before Casino. Reports say his Kwaka-4 was OK & rideable home.

Overall, the Bruxner H'/way was in reasonable condition, but with a few bad areas especially near Mallanganee and Piora. Traffic was generally light, but road-works near the Old Bonalbo turn-off at Sandilands meant a boring 10+ minutes wait, this type of long stoppage [as usual] leading to the annoying "bunching" of vehicles.

Fuel is not available at Drake + the servo at Tabulam is closed, so the only option for smaller capacity tanks is the '91' on offer from their friendly rural store there. A point to remember in future. But fuel is also available at Koreela and Bonalbo. Riding onto Tenterfield for fuel is also an option - as many did, but I returned via Casino then to Lismore after my welcome top-up at Tabulam.

A mobile road-side speed-camera was spotted at Ramsay's Rd near Drake and on return to Lismore the very same hero was observed lying in wait on the ever-popular McKees Hill straight. [I wish the RMS would target more dangerous road areas, rather than opt for surreptitious revenue-collection on well-maintained/safer 100Kmph roads.]

But these events did not spoil this trip, as the long fast straights into and out of Drake around Yellow Creek, framed by lovely avenues of tall gum-trees with very little traffic was most memorable and worthwhile. A longer [210Km] Run than normal, returned to Lismore by 1.45 pm. R. A.

Five riders braved the drizzle and rode via Rous Road, Meerschaum Vale and Broadwater, passing through the national park on the rather bumpy road much frequented by the summer-sun migrant RV crowd. It was good to see The Mill in full operation again, around one year from their disasterous 2022 flood.

It was good to see some prudent early hazard-reduction burns on the way there by the very pro-active Broadwater bush fire brigade.

I was late for coffee at the Kiosk, after stopping to adjust the Ryker brake-pedal, plus a supplementary fill-up at Evans to try and understand its fuel gauge's apparently idiosyncratic behaviour. Full capacity was (at last) calculated at 22L – with this filling proceeding way past the 'full' on the bar-gauge. Lesson learned. Return to Lismore was via Woodburn on far better & faster roads across the cane-flats and much brighter riding conditions. A minor red-light hold-up at Wyrallah village for major road-works, a nasty pot-hole near the outskirts to be avoided. Overall an enjoyable ride with low traffic density.

The Mid Week Run on the first Wednesday of each month is specifically designed as a shorter/local club ride, being suitable for all machines of all types. While the second Wednesday is for longer distance enthusiasts - but always including the option for short-range riders to turn back home at any time, just as long as this is notified beforehand to ride-leader.

So I hope to see more smaller capacity and classic machines taking part in this organised club ride in future months.

Warm clothing advised, but don't over-do it as I did this time!

I returned to a sunny Lismore at 11.45am with a fairly typical 96Km mileage for this ride.

Vic Laverda High Country Run 17th to 21st March 2023

We joined the 2023 Victorian Laverda Clubs annual high country gallop which covers many of the interesting alpine and high country roads for 5 days of great riding.

This year had some 13 participants on 12 bikes, with Jan & I being only 2 up bike, as is usual down this way as we are finding very few clubs which include pillions.

Anyway they are a friendly and welcoming bunch with this years group including some moderns being a KTM adventure bike and softail Harley, a sole Guzzi to keep em honest, being us, one BMW adventure bike with the rest being a mix of RGS and Jota tripples and 1 extremely quick and well ridden SFC 750 twin.

Day 1 – Whilst the group left Melbourne to travel to Talangatta for the first night, being so much closer we opted to take a longer run to relive fond memories and stay at the Jingelic bridge hotel. 
made the full trip with the black tape still in tact!

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
