
This year's Triples Rally ran from the $19^{th} - 21^{st}$ August and was again based at the beautiful seaside town of Evans Head, Northern NSW.



My recent working trip overseas - by Dean Marsh; part 1 (part 2 in October newsletter)

I remember as if it were yesterday Dad (Alec Marsh) sitting up late at night writing articles to go into the NRMCC newsletter. Time to carry on Dad's legacy and contribute to the club that enabled Dad to enjoy his love for classic motorcycles while being in the company of his old bikie mates.

I can never go overseas on a work trip without throwing in some pleasure activities which of course always involves 2 wheels. Whether its on a mountain biking adventure, a race meeting or even just a m/cycle museum the last trip I went on involved all 3. Back in April I attended a "Study Tour", Study Tour being the word used by Tractor salesman to tell our wives about work trips

that usually involves drinking a lot of beer with like - minded tractor salesman on the other side of the world. This study tour was to ALO's manufacturing facilities in Ningbo China and Umeo Sweden. Like most successful AG based companies today ALO was started by the need for one man in the early 1900's to make manual farm chores easier, Karl Astrom invented the very first tractor front end loader and today ALO is the largest front-end loader manufacturer in the world making 35,000 loaders per year.

After travelling through regional China where your motorcycle wears the gloves (see pic 1) it was a very nice sight to land in Sweden and be greeted with an array of Nilfisk motorised wheel chairs (See pic 2). In 1918 Nilfisk made the very first Nimbus motorcycle – The Stovepipe. The

> ALO Head office was in a small town Umeo, a 2 hour flight North from Stockholm. Ironically almost the whole town worked for ALO and in one way or another most of the factory staff we spoke to were related to the founder!! How would

you like to pay 75% of your wage in taxes but have free medical, pay no school or university fees, no rates and cheap car rego? I suppose that's why Sweden a county less than half the size of Australia can lay claim to fame for such brands as IKEA, Electrolux, Ericsson, Skype, VOLVO, ALO, ABBA, Absolut Vodka and the most successful speedway rider of his time Tony Rickardsson.

After the work part was done in Umeo it was time for a 2 day Snow Mobiling expedition landing us in our own Ski Resort for the afternoon. As it turns out the tour guide owned the ski mountain, the season was over for the year and he basically said to the group the mountain is yours. With endless mountains that rolled up to the sky and trails that I reckon led back to Aust I had a 800cc Snow mobile underneath me I was like a kid in a candie shop.

Our last day in Sweden was a day trip to the ABBA museum, then an early night as I was leaving the group and heading to England (via Munich construction Expo) on a 4am flight to see my relatives (Dads great Aunty and Cousins some of whom I haven't seen for 15 years).
