

There are a number of DVDs in the club library on motorcycling and on specific marques and races. These are always interesting, especially if they have a his-

toric collection of material. I have a DVD about the history of Rob Roy hillclimb in


Victoria, unfortunately no longer with us. (Cursed urban sprawl and developers!) It ran from 1935 to 1961

Most of the video is of cars, but a significant number of Motorcycles also took up the challenge of the hill. I've never seen a motorcycle tackle a hillclimb—it seems a

bit hairy to me, but then I don't drag the footpegs on corners anyway.

The DVD has expert commentaries by well known motor racers including Bruce Walton—6 times Australian hillclimb champion, and motorcycle demon, Max Rathbone.

The Club Library has a very large collection of books, DVDs and workshop and parts Manuals.



From The Librarian:

People ask me whether we have such and such a manual— or a book to help with notes on restoration details or marque history. Or even just an interesting exploration of motorcycle history and adventure.

I've no problem with being asked, but if you have access to the internet, you can easily explore the library in the club website so you can ask for a particular book—often by number.

Just go to the website—www.nrcmcc.org.— this will bring up the home page with a list of options including NEWS which will bring up all the newsletters online and in brilliant colour (I always feel guilty about the B&W printed versions, but to print in colour would be prohibitively expensive)

Near the bottom of the list is LIBRARY—click on this and you'll go to the library page. You'll be given the options of search by Author (if you happen to know them, for example if you're looking to see if we have a particular book), or search by Make of Bike, ie Triumph. Or, if you're game you can search the whole collection listed in alphabetical order by authors name. You never know what you might find of interest.

If you search by Author, ie Ian Falloon, you'll get a list of all his books in the library. If you search by Make, you'll be able to type in the marque you want and all books on that marque will be listed. Books with many marques will be listed under 'Various'

Magazines are listed under 'Magazines' and manuals similarly are listed under 'Manuals'' So please make use of our library—it's great if you end up ill in bed—just get in touch. RS
