50th Anniversary- 2018 Triumph Trident & BSA Rocket 3

These classic British motorcycles were produced from 1968 until 1975/6. Although they were - and still are - exciting motorcycles they arrived too late to save the BSA motorcycle group (which included both the BSA and the Triumph marques). BSA ceased major production in 1972 and Triumph followed shortly thereafter in 1975.

The Triples were the first true superbike & also the last major motorcycle developed by the original Triumph Engineering Co. The bikes were the first move from the traditional vertical twin and were on the drawing board from 1963.

Over 7 years approx. 24,480 Rocket 3's & Tridents were produced.

First introduced in 1968, the bikes claim to fame was "the fastest production bike in the world". This only lasted 4 weeks until the Honda 750 Four was released. (5mph faster in a straight line).

The British triples did not have the 5-speed gearbox, overhead camshaft, electric start and disc brake of the Honda, but were still faster around a circuit due to their better handling. The 5th gear came in 1971 and the disc brake in 1973

The factory prepared Trident "Slippery Sam" proved to be the most famous with wins at the Isle of Man TT Production Bike Events, over 5 consecutive years.

Many other bikes were successful with the "Rob North" framed machines winning many races.

The X-75 Hurricane was released in 1972 with approx. 1046 bikes made. These bikes were designed for the American market by Craig Vetter. The sleek design appealed to some however the demand was not there, and continued production was abandoned.



In 1975 the T160 Trident was produced with a rear disc, electric starter and left foot gear change, this was the final year of production. The last of the Trident range "The Cardinal" had a run of 200 and were sold to the Saudi Police Force.

The 750cc- 3 cyl. engine had 60hp in standard trim, however later development obtained 90hp with 140mph.

This year's Aussie Triples Rally No9 is being held at Evans Head: 17-19 August. The Monday following the Event many entrants are riding to Inverell, where the local Club are hosting us until the Thursday when we ride to Grafton to join the Clarence Club's Annual Rally. 10 days of Tripling.

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Over the years, all the Entrants have remarked on the quality of Marshalling for our Event and many thanks go to NRCMCC Members who assist with this.

We also have a T160 being ridden from Albany, South of Perth. He rode to our Rally 5 years ago and has stated that it has taken 5 years for his bum to recover.



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Centenary Veteran Motorcycle Rally Peaks Crossing QLD June 2018

The old saying of "put on an event and they will come" proved correct for the Centenary Rally. This rally was a thought of some of the veteran motorcycle riders of HMCCQ, when they realised that 2018 was a lay year for the veteran rally. The idea of not celebrating the coming of age, 100 years old or more of every veteran motorcycle was not an opportunity that they could miss. They started with an idea that they would get a few QLD veteran riders but the word quickly spread to NSW and then to Vic. Bryson & I along with Alan & Lyn didn't want to miss out so we quickly filled out our expression of interest and accommodation. Now was time to get the old bikes ready, Bryson worked on manufactured a better over centre clutch lever for my BSA, as old one has a reputation of jumping in and not staying disengaged not matter how hard you try to hold it in with your foot. This made riding the machine rather dangerous for a novice veteran rider like me, if the machine is in gear it could take off sometimes without the riders or when you come to a major busy road and your try to engage the clutch if will not stay in thus not allowing the machine to stop safely, a scary problem as you can imagine. Bryson's bike also had a problem that became apparent on the 1 & 2 Cylinder Rally at Yamba of the fuel cap leaking fuel; Bryson manufactured a new cap from a chunk of brass as he knew that he would need to be able to fill the tank. The bikes both were also checked over for loose bolts & nuts as the shaking tends to loosen and drop these.

Members of the club were interested to know about the rally, as it was so close to our area, they wanted to be able to see the 70 so veteran machines entered. There was a contingent who camped at Boonah Showground and rode to a range of locations that the veteran rally was visiting to view the machines and to catch up with friends. The other group were the Wednesday Group who rode up and met us at the Kalbar Pub where we had lunch. It was fantastic to see both groups of enthusiasts and I'm sure they were amazed at the number and array of motorbikes. Thank you to both groups of riders, many of the participants commented on your attendance and when told where you were from they were impressed in your keenness to travel to see the veteran motorcycles.

The rally routes took us mostly on secondary and lesser roads as we are travelling at around 40-50km per hour some faster others slower.

Friday's shake down ride was a small loop around Peaks crossing with 22km travelled we didn't attend this as our arrival was too late.

Saturday was a Display at Lobley park in Ipswich, this ride I opted out of as it had 7 sets of traffic lights to get through and most of these were up hill starts – not good for veterans. Many did ride and many wished they hadn't but there was a lot of interest from the general public which was good the ride back once again took us through the traffic lights and was a great 60km of mostly back roads total distance 79km. The campers from Boonah first caught up with us and it was lovely to see club members enjoy the old bikes.

Sunday took us to morning tea at Moogerah Dam via Kalbar with lunch at Harrisville's Royal hotel with a distance of 83km travelled. Bryson's bike lost the cotter pin from a pedal so had to travel on the back up trailer. Once again the Boonah enjoyed their ride to catch up with us at the dam, well maybe not so enjoyable it was a very cold day with a lazy wind we were all cold and windblown. When the wind first came up it was very strong and it caught me at a cement flood way crossing with no cover it moved me on the road severely, before this I was watching the road in front and behind, the oiler dripping and looking for pothole, not watching the trees but after me little trip I also watched the trees for the wind. Bryson replaced his missing pin and was ready for the road again the next day.

Monday- Boonah State School for morning tea, displaying the bikes in the playground for the children to see, they were amazed that they looked nothing like a modern bike asking many questions, Bryson loved the little cakes. Onto Mt Alford for lunch and back to Peaks Crossing via Kalbar total distance of 123km the biggest day.

Tuesday morning Mick & Donna with the Douglas to give it a go, Mick wasn't overly happy with it due to not being able to give it a good rod test at home, but was going to ride it and see what happened. Donna was his back up vehicle and workshop tools, he got as far as Coleyville area before the inlet valve stuck (tight valve guide) onto the vehicle and travel to Warrill View Park for morning tea with the local Rural Fire Service, Mick madly worked on the Douglas but had to leave it on their vehicle until the lunch stop at Rosewood's Anzac Hall where we partook of a two course lunch. Mick got it going and completing the days ride back to Peaks Crossing. A long ride of 100.5km.

Wednesday ride took us to Roadvale Museum, a private museum of mostly machinery bikes, vehicles and motors, and also all things old. Scones cream & jam and a cupper for morning tea and a long wander around to look at this amazing collection. Soon it was time to move on travelling through Boonah, the Fassiffern Valley and onto the Royal Hotel at Kalbar for lunch. This is where the Wednesday ride group caught up with us, it was great to see them and they I'm sure had a great time checking out the bikes. I didn't catch up with them all as many were outside looking at the bikes and we were inside with lunch. This ride was the second longest but not by much a distance of 105.4km. Mick and Donna left us late in the afternoon as Donna had to work the next day.

Thursday wow!! The last day we were having so much fun that the days just slipped by well it was on the road to Kalbar State School for morning tea and what a morning tea it was it looked like a high tea with cakes on three tiered stands, once again the children viewed the bikes asking questions and having a good time. On to lunch at Aratula Hotel, returning to Peaks Crossing through Charlwood, Fassifern Valley, Kalbar and Kents Lagoon. This our late days ride of 95.4km continued next page

Finally huge thank you to Lyn who followed the bikes around very slowly with tools and most importantly fuel we needed to fuel up at lunch time every day for the return trip home.
