



I asked Penrite Oils a question about fork oil. Their reply might be of interest to club members. *Please find below some further information in regards to our Knowledge Centre information on Fork oils. "Heavier fluids speed up the rebound performance but are slower to react than lighter fluids. This is because they cannot move through the system as fast as a lighter fluid. Heavier fluids also take some of the energy that would go into the spring.*

In terms of ride stiffness, this is controlled mainly by the spring rates. Lighter fork oils give a faster reaction time that can make them feel more skittish on the road or give the feel of a harder ride. Heavier hydraulic fluids develop more air bubbles than lighter fluids and air is 10,000 times more compressible that oil. Heavier fluids are more likely to release air when they are hot which lowers compressibility giving a softer effect. Forks also have internal mechanical springing, These are what really set the stiffness, The fluids controls the rebound and damping quality."




